



Dear Sisters,

Tuesday, May 26, 2026, in the heart of the night, at 3:52 AM (local time), from the Divine Master Community in Mexico City, Jesus the Divine Master called our sister to eternal life

SR. M. FE – M. ELENA MAGAÑA MEDINA
born on June 5, 1936, in La Quemadita, Puruándiro, Michoacán (Mexico).

Two days after her birth, on June 7, she was brought to the baptismal font to receive the great gift of the Christian faith and enter into the family of God. She was the fourth of ten children.

She entered the Congregation on May 29, 1960, at the age of 24, in the Divine Master Community in Mexico City, preceded by her sisters, Sr. M. Esperanza Magaña († 20-10-1974) and Sr. M. Amada Magaña († 19-05-2024), both of whom were younger.

At the conclusion of the novitiate, on March 25, 1963, she made her religious profession in the Divine Master Community in Mexico City (CDMX). On March 25, 1968, she made her perpetual profession in the Divine Master Community in Boston, Massachusetts, in the United States.

The journey of discipleship of Sr. M. Fe was strongly marked from her youth by the missionary dimension and priestly service. In 1963, as a sister in temporary vows, she was sent to the Casa San Paolo in Mexico City, at the Pauline seminary, where she joyfully offered her service and the fervor of prayer for the vocational growth of the many young men who entered the Society of St. Paul. A short time later, she was asked to continue the priestly service in the United States, where she remained from 1965 until 1976, in various communities: Staten Island, Boston, Dearborn and Berkeley. In each of these communities, she committed herself to giving the best of herself in every gesture and sign of maternal care for the priests and young men who arrived, always convinced that she was serving the Divine Master present in each of them, as Mary Most Holy did for Jesus.

In 1976, after various years spent outside of her native land, she returned to the Province of Mexico and joined the Divine Master Community in Monterrey, where she remained until 1988. During this time, she carried out the mission in the Liturgical Apostolate Center, collaborating also in the sewing workroom. She was appointed local superior of the same community for two terms.



At the conclusion of this time, she was again asked to carry out her mission outside of her native country. In 1988, she was sent to Italy to offer her service in various tasks in Vatican City, primarily in the kitchen. She remained there until her return to Mexico in 2001.

Upon her return to the Mexican Province, she continued her generous collaboration in the sewing workroom of the Divine Master Community in Guadalajara and Monterrey until 2024, when she was transferred to the Divine Master Community in Mexico City.

Sr. M. Fe was raised in a large family that was deeply rooted in Christian values. Throughout her life, since her time of living in the family, she was greatly appreciated for her patience, serenity and sense of responsibility. From the moment she entered the Congregation, she was convinced that being a Sister Disciple of the Divine Master was her vocation and the journey of life to which the Lord had called her. She incarnated this ideal throughout her life, incorporating it even into her religious name: Fe (Faith). Progressively she became a person who was trustworthy, one who inspired confidence and brought closeness in every community. Some sisters, coordinators of the communities, bear witness to the quality of her religious life to which she sought to remain coherent, always nurtured by the daily encounter with the Divine Master in the adoration. She distinguished herself in living the values of consecrated life, especially through her profound sense of obedience to the superiors, which she showed through daily and ordinary details.


Her Pauline journey of conforming to Christ the Master was strongly marked by a silent, simple, humble and total dedication in everything she did, as well as a great sense of humor through which she brought joy to the Sisters, even in times of greater trial and difficulty. These qualities accompanied her to the last moments of her life, when she could no longer speak and communicated only with gestures and a few sounds.

While she was in the Divine Master Community in Mexico City, her health worsened: she began to have problems with the knees until she was no longer able to move. Despite this, she continued to work untiringly and creatively with her hands: embroidering crosses on purificators and corporals with agility and precision. Her speed in this art also inspired the young women of the community and she transmitted to them the artistic secrets she had acquired.

Due to chronic renal insufficiency, she gradually weakened until, in the first hours of May 26, 2026, at 3:52 AM, surrounded by the sisters of the community and sustained by their prayer, she went to encounter the Lord, who invited her to celebrate his eternal Passover.

Sr. M. Fe transmitted to us a transparency of life, a deep love for the priests entrusted to us by our special mission; her attention to detail and respect for each of the Sisters with whom she shared the vocation over the years. May her legacy be received by other young women or collaborators in the mission that the Kingdom of God may continue to grow and bear fruit, now and forever.
